Psalm 23 has a strange verse in it that says, "Thou prepares a table for me in the presence of my enemies." Lou Giglio, in our opinion, explains this odd verse in a very clear way in a lesson called Don't Give the Enemy a Seat at Your Table. He paints a picture of God preparing a table to sit and commune with just Him. Despite the bountiful feast of the fruit of the spirit that are on the table including love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness and self control, Giglio illustrates how often we choose to let the enemy have a seat at the table.

The enemy likes to come and sit at your table and add his own dishes. The fruit he brings are the opposite of the fruit of the spirit. He brings hate, division, despair, anxiety, panic, harshness and self indulgence. If only it was that obvious and the list were that black and white contrast making it clear to us who is sitting at God's table with us; but the enemy does not want you to know he has taken a seat – and you have let him.

Our ranch table has a variety of things on it from time to time. It could be meals or snacks or games. It might be school books and bibles. It might be Kleenex boxes and tears. Quite often the question is asked, "Who is sitting at your table"? We use this question as a reminder to our students and ourselves to protect that table that God has invited us to sit at.

Just like we recognize a tree by the fruit it bears, we can recognize the presence of God's Spirit by the fruit on our table. If love, joy and peace are missing then the enemy has a seat at your table. As quickly as he snuck in, he can be kicked out. Invite God back to the table that He has prepared for you

It has been such a wonderful experience working with the people at Broken Arrow Youth Ranch. There has been a lot of interaction with staff and students as well as getting to know our neighbours. This is going on our second year come November 2024. We have learned so much from everyone. The students are amazing. It has been great to watch them get to know who Christ is. We have felt honoured to be a part of their journey. God has blessed us richly to be apart of this Broken Arrow family. Humbled to be called His.
